Missionary Sisters of the Precious Blood

OUR SPIRIT & SERVICE

In 1885 the Missionary Sisters of the Precious Blood were founded in South Africa by a Trappist Abbot. Later in 1925 sisters from Germany came to Princeton, NJ. In 1952, due to growing numbers and needs, the motherhouse, Precious Blood Convent, was relocated to Reading, PA. Since that time the sisters have been instrumental in providing leadership to initiatives that impact eastern PA, and mission abroad. The sisters approach to mission is not as settlers but as pioneers. Their dedication to mission is evident in the following list of accomplishments.







1961 Bishop McShea gave the Sisters the responsibility to run the newly established **Holy Family Manor** nursing and rehabilitation center in Bethlehem, PA.

1968 The Sisters established a neighborhood community center in Reading, known as **Kennedy House**.

1976 The Sisters opened the original **Mariawald** as a Renewal Center on the Convent Property

1981 Bishop McShea, with the assistance of the Sisters, established the **Holy Family Villa**, a retirement home for priests in Bethlehem, PA.

1982 The Sisters recognized a unique opportunity to service children with special needs, and founded the John Paul II School for Special Learning at the St. Cyril and Methodius Parochial School in Reading. The school has moved and is now located on property next to the motherhouse.

1991 Dayspring Homes was founded in Reading, PA in response to older parents who were desperately looking for a place for their special needs sons and daughters. They wanted to die in peace knowing their loved one would be cared for in a Christian based environment. With the encouragement of Bishop Welsh, and thanks to Fr. Thomas Edwards, the Sisters were able to open the first home.



Our mission is the Kingdom of God which has no boundaries.

2023 The community of sisters determined that there was a regional need for an expanded **Spiritual Renewal Center**.





The current Mariawald Center is fully utilized throughout the year. Numerous groups cannot be accommodated due to group size or because the facility is not available. The newly proposed Renewal center will be located adjacent to the current building and will address several needs:

- 23 guest rooms with private bathrooms
- a chapel with 9 stained glass windows
- large conference room for group presentations
- full service kitchen and dining room
- · a pastor's suite
- three private spiritual direction rooms
- fully accessible and including an elevator

The Mariawald Renewal Center is situated on 90 acres of beautiful rural woodland in Berks County. With 2 ponds, walking trails, and a grotto, it is hard to believe that the city is less than a mile away.
